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# OUR MISSION IS TO END THE GLOBAL AIDS EPIDEMIC THROUGH INNOVATIVE RESEARCH.

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amfAR is one of the world's leading nonprofit organizations dedicated to the support of AIDS research, HIV prevention, treatment education, and advocacy.

Since 1985, amfAR has raised \$900 million in support of its programs and has awarded more than 3,800 grants to research teams worldwide.

# Why We Need A Cure

While antiretroviral therapies have extended the lives of millions, an HIV cure would help end the AIDS epidemic once and for all. amfAR raises funds to support the work of innovative researchers around the world.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, **85.6 million people** have acquired HIV and **40.4 million** have died of AIDS-related illnesses.

AIDS claims a **life a minute**.

In 2023, an estimated **1.3 million people** newly acquired HIV, bringing the global total to **39 million living with HIV**.

**4,000 adolescent women and girls** (aged 15 to 24) acquired HIV every week in 2023, including 3,100 in sub-Saharan Africa.

**1.4 million children** (under 15 years old) are living with HIV, including 120,000 who acquired HIV in 2023.



# Accelerating Cure Innovations

**Breakthrough Horizons Fund** by amfAR is a bold initiative to fast-track cure research for viral infections and emerging viral threats. By focusing on HIV cure efforts and leveraging insights across multiple disciplines, the Fund positions itself at the forefront of scientific innovation.

- Accelerate cutting-edge research towards a HIV cure
- Leverage HIV cure research to catalyze broader biomedical breakthroughs
- Foster cross-disciplinary collaborations that unlock new treatment pathways and address emerging health challenges linked to viral infections
- Help translate scientific discoveries into transformative global health solutions



# Our Programs

amfAR is dedicated to AIDS research, HIV prevention, treatment education, and the advocacy of sound AIDS-related public policy through four programs:



## RESEARCH

amfAR's biomedical research program is dedicated to finding a cure for HIV by supporting the field's most innovative approaches, including cell and gene therapy, immunotherapy, and broadly neutralizing antibodies.



## PUBLIC POLICY

amfAR's Washington, D.C.-based Public Policy Office conducts evidence-based research into HIV and other health threats and advocates for transparent, human rights-based domestic and global responses to the pandemic.



## TREAT ASIA

Therapeutics Research, Education, and AIDS Training in Asia (TREAT Asia) is a network of clinics, hospitals, and research institutions working with civil society to improve standards of care and expand access to treatment across the Asia-Pacific region.



## PUBLIC INFORMATION

amfAR publishes and disseminates information on important HIV-related research, treatment, prevention, and policy issues for diverse audiences to increase awareness and knowledge of the pandemic.

# What Sets amfAR Apart

With its independence, flexibility, and emphasis on collaboration, amfAR punches above its weight and plays a unique catalytic role in HIV/AIDS research.

amfAR has a **proven history** of funding innovative research that has led to the development of effective treatments for HIV and the use of antiretroviral drugs to prevent mother-to-child transmission of the virus.

A **risk-tolerant funding strategy** allows amfAR to support projects that explore scientifically sound but untested hypotheses, funding goal-oriented, investigator-originated studies that may lack the preliminary data required by traditional funders.

amfAR is able to **shift directions and respond quickly** to emerging opportunities – amfAR has employed its proven expertise and cutting-edge innovation to help combat emerging health threats such as COVID-19, mpox, cervical cancer, and more.

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## RARE CANCER SEEN IN 41 HOMOSEXUALS

Outbreak Occurs Among Men  
in New York and California  
— 8 Died Inside 2 Years

Doctors in New York and California have diagnosed among homosexual men 41 cases of a rare and often rapidly fatal form of cancer. Eight of the victims died less than 24 months after the diagnosis was made.

The cause of the outbreak is unknown, and there is as yet no evidence of contagion. But the doctors who have made the diagnoses, mostly in New York City and the San Francisco Bay area, are alerting other physicians who treat large numbers of homosexual men to the problem in an effort to help identify more cases and to reduce the delay in offering chemotherapy treatment.

The sudden appearance of the cancer, called Kaposi's Sarcoma, has prompted a medical investigation that experts say could have as much scientific as public health importance because of what it may teach about determining the causes of more common types of cancer.

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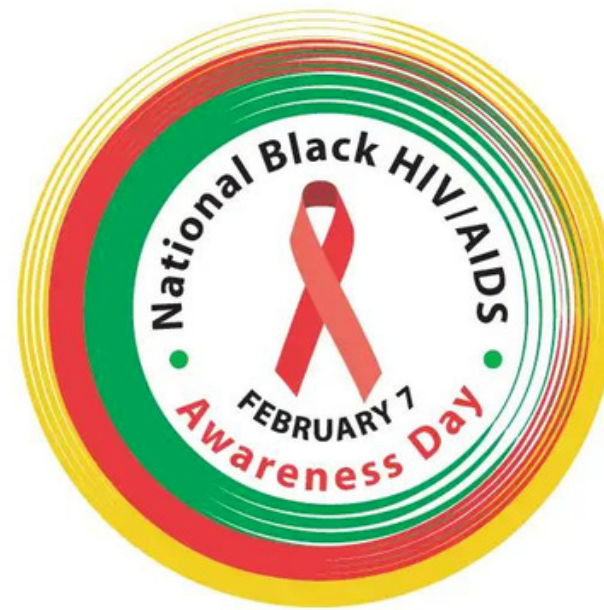
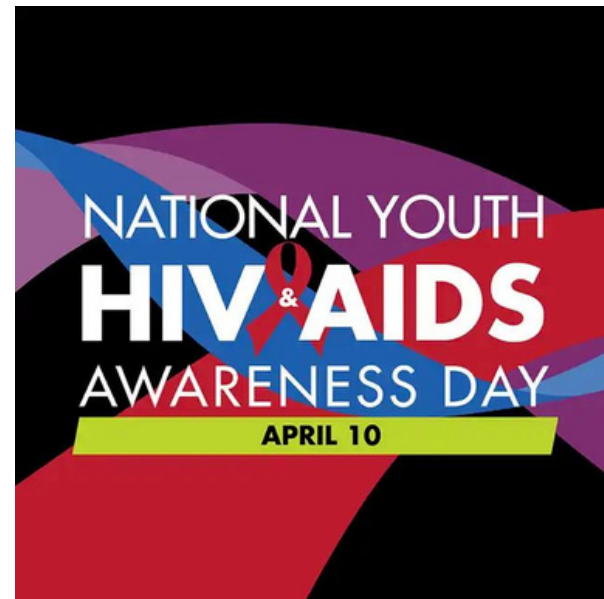

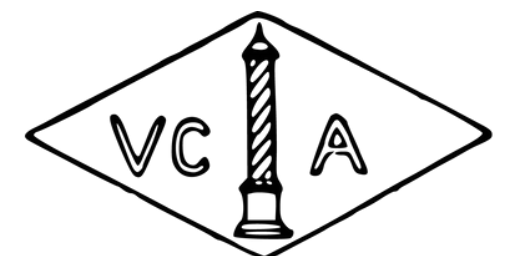
